English Curriculum Statement

Intent

Students will have the opportunity to engage with and create a wide variety and diversity of texts to prepare them for literacy for meaning and pleasure, and reading, writing, and speaking and listening skills for life. They will practise reading and have extra support if they need it. Students will develop their writing skills through creative writing. They will develop speaking and listening skills through lively class discussions about a wide range of topics.

Implementation
