

Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) and climbing frame @ Backworth






Belonging & New Beginnings





World Kindness Day

😊 **Whole-school community atmosphere:** staff and pupils celebrating together to build connection and belonging


🧁 **Pudsey-themed baking:** pupils worked together to create Pudsey-inspired treats, building practical skills, confidence and teamwork
